* Rehearsal numbers (1, 2, 3, 4, etc.) in the instrumental parts correspond to the verse number and the numbers/letter to each subsequent occurrence of the REFRAIN (1A, 2A, etc.)

** At the last occurrence of REFRAIN, both trumpets play the soprano/tenor descant. The first trombone plays the melody line in the tenor range and the second trombone plays the bass line as found in the organ accompaniment. The timpani does not change.
